



Drug Handout: Sildenafil

What is Sildenafil?

Sildenafil belongs to a group of medications that delay the breakdown of the enzyme phosphodiesterase 5. It increases substances in the body that induce vasodilation (relaxation of arteries/ veins) within certain regions of blood vessels, like those found in the lungs.

Uses/Indications

 Pulmonary Hypertension secondary to primary respiratory disease (chronic bronchitis, COPD, pulmonary fibrosis), chronic mitral valve disease or thromboembolic disease (blood clots).

Adverse Effects [please contact CVCA should any of these symptoms be noted]

- Low risk for decreased appetite, vomiting or diarrhea
- Low blood pressure resulting in lethargy and weakness
- Skin flushing

Client Information

- Can be given with or without food
- Comes in tablet form, but can be reformulated into capsules and liquid suspensions

- Commonly used with other cardiac and respiratory medications
- Does not require any specific monitoring

Interactions with Other Drugs

- Increased risk for low systemic blood pressure when used with other vasodilators (amlodipine, acepromazine, phenoxybenzamine, nitrates)
- Ketoconazole, itraconazole, cimetidine, erythromycin, and clarithromycin may increase blood levels
- Phenobarbital may decrease blood levels lowering efficacy
- The doctors at CVCA have taken this into account, however, please feel free to contact CVCA regarding any concurrent medications your pet may be prescribed
