10 SIGNS OF HEART DISEASE

- Persistent Cough
- Difficulty Breathing
- Fainting/Collapsing
- Abdominal Swelling/Distention
- Less Tolerance to Exercise
- Heart Murmur
- Change in Heart Rate
- Change in Body Weight
- Restless Behavior/Hiding
- Loss of Appetite
- = WARRANTS IMMEDIATE VISIT TO VETERINARIAN

HEART DISEASE IN CATS

Heart disease affects

15% of all cats.

In many cases, cats with heart problems do not show signs of disease.

Commonly affected breeds include:

HEART DISEASE IN DOGS

After the age of 5, the risk of canine heart disease increases significantly.

Valvular disease affects dogs:

20-25%

30-35%
