10 SIGNS OF HEART DISEASE

- ♥ Persistent Cough
- ♥ Difficulty Breathing
- ♥ Fainting/Collapsing
- ♥ Abdominal Swelling/Distention
- ♥ Less Tolerance to Exercise
- ♥ Heart Murmur
- ♥ Change in Heart Rate
- ♥ Change in Body Weight
- ♥ Restless Behavior/Hiding
- ♥ Loss of Appetite

HEART DISEASE IN CATS

Heart disease affects
15% of all cats.

In many cases, cats with heart problems do not show signs of disease.

Commonly affected breeds include:

American Shorthair | Maine Coon | Persian | Ragdoll | Siamese



HEART DISEASE IN DOGS

After the age of 5, the risk of canine heart disease increases significantly.

Valvular disease affects dogs:

15% | **20-25%** | **30-35%**
ages 5-8 | ages 9-12 | ages 13+

Commonly affected breeds include:

Boxer | Cavalier King Charles Spaniel | Dachshunds | Doberman Pinscher
Golden Retriever | Miniature/Toy Poodle | Miniature Schnauzer
